Rough all the way, & rainy, but no one in family ill.

June 20 - Arrive Liverpool, disembark 10 A.M. train leaves 11 A.M., arrive London 5 P.M.

Tape to Monty. Junior & Johnny pretty good room, B & 2 in attic, Hotel holds 225. - more of about 6 old. Lunch put to gether. Dinner with the Bates's. Thelma Brauer. Ate at French. Rain threatened.

June 21

To Parliament Bldgs. in A. M.
Then to Big Ben, Westminster Bridge,
F.B.9, 10 Downing St. Tomb of
Unknown Soldier, W. War T., up Whitehall
to Trafalgar Sq.

After lunch on France Train to
Tower, St. Paul's, Fleet Street, etc.
Saw the Jaggers of Monterey, Tea at Mount Royal
Essexy, to Raddles Well Theatre to
Etoiles de Paris, dinner, modern
Then light snack at Piccadilly.

June 22

To Westminster Abbey, service 10:30
Rain off & on all day.

Back to hotel for lunch.

Then to Hyde Park - Queen receiving foot
loops of provinces.

To Tate Gallery. B saw all he had listed.
More Hyde Park.

Dinner in Bats at Lyons at Piccadilly,
17 Star Restaurant.

June 23 - Late start in car, Ford Consul.

Driver took me beyond most of
tiffin. Goes to remembers

To Windsor. Saw the Penguin Tower
for first time.

Then to Salisbury to the Rose & Crown.

Then walk around Cathedral before
dinner, & along walk beside the river.

24th Drove around Salisbury before going
on. Would like to spend a week
there. Picnic lunch on the way, &
then on to Straker at Weycroft Hall,
Cepminster. A perfectly charming
place made over from very old manor
hall with some remains dating to
Roman days (bricks in old oven in lower
apt.). They showed us all around
the estate. They have done wonders to the
place and have obviously had much
fun doing it & furnishing it. Beautiful
gardens. Tea & dinner there & much con-
versation. Sally was there & delightful.
One of the best episodes of our trip. I am
sure.

On to

for the night (mid-night!)

25th A very dreary day. Really stormy & I
think even a gale at Plymouth. Picnic
lunch on Dartmoor, but so stormy we
couldn't get out of the car.

Drove around Exeter, but got out only to buy
caps (rain), for the boys and to buy food for
lunch. On to Plymouth. Saw steps from
which Pilgrims sailed. Very stormy. Pater, at

Grand Hotel found rooms for us
at Carlyon Bay Hotel near St
Austell in Cornwall (after 400's tie
elsewhere). Turned out to be very
pleasant resort hotel, large. Picked up
Loose en route.

Went up one way lane to Pendreffle's
farm to engine & bed & board, but
not for us.

26th Retraced steps to Polperro where we
wandered around. Lunched. Children
most enthusiastic. Bought individual
pasties for lunch. Excellent -
Across Cornwall to Tintagel - tea
with strawberry jam, Devonshire cream
& scones. On to Clavell. Lunched as
always. Went in rowboat for 1/2 hr. On
to Woodford Bridge in Trelawny Darnall -
a perfectly lovely country hotel.
Pleasant accommodation, excellent food,
beautiful gardens & charming host.
The other guests friendly & delightful.
Hope to go there again.

27th Rather late start. Hated to leave.
Took long way round over narrow &
very hilly roads - across Exmoor. Left

to get rooms at Bell Hotel.

28th A very fine day. First drove on to
Tintern which is one of the most beautiful
spots I know, and one of the " " "
Britain. Then across country, very
narrow winding hilly roads to Ross, then
pebbles beach at the White Castle which
we "discovered" on a side road. An
old 12th century fortress now in
delightful & well kept ruin. Perfect
picnic spots.

Then to Wincborne via Gloucester
Cheltenham. Skirted air show - wish we
could have stayed to see it.

Arrived The Barn in time for tea.
Simply charming spot - small farm,
owned by Mrs. Carleton, takes paying
guests. Room for 6. By recommendation
only. Completely lovely.

29th Johnnie altered motor boat for 2 hrs in
at ^{at Tisbury} Tisbury.
A very lovely winding river people fishing
every 20 ft. separated from each other by the
hill grass. (saw a fish about 4" caught).

P.M. went to Cirencester to pale match with
Mrs. Carleton & Mrs. McMeel. ^{Case of Baxters' axe} 5x7 miles.

Stopped on way home at Col. Mrs. Rensselaer Gretton,
& went there & their 500 yr old house at

Did big laundry at noon - all by evening & could iron in t wash house.
Canada in evening with boys.

30th to Stratford & Warwick
Lea at Chipping Candee.
Loved Broadway, as we drove thru it.
Back to t Barns for t 3rd night.

July 1 - To Oxford - walked around about on town & half. Then on to the Pinks at Rongford for dinner & t night. Very hospitable. Small house, nice garden. Lewis 1.8, Mavis 1.5. Derek, Emily's boy - friend, came over.

2nd Rainy so did not go to Cambridge but straight to London, Great Eastern Hotel. There was no room at Modyn. Bought sweaters for t boys & for got one for Andy. Stays at Liberty's. Dinner at the Lyons at Marble Arch. Long bus ride to hotel thru Fleet St & Threadneedle.

3rd To t Tower to go thru t White Tower, saw changes & went there and saw rocks & ship train. Awful noise & leader. Boys stayed home in P.M. & for t I shopped. 6 silver coffee spoons.

Hth A.M. to National Gallery. Bobby very cute & serious. We developed & septem of asking the guide (an attendant in each room) to show us + pictures on Bobby's list. They were all very glad to + I think quite interested in his interest. Lunch in Gallery Restaurant + then to British Museum - saw especially + mummies + + Rosette stone. Johnny off by himself. Tea at Piccadilly Hotel, to see where John will be in 2 days. Very nice + 40 times more - Strauss etc.

Elizabethan Room at Gore Hotel is evening. Lots of fun. Very 17th century - straw on floor, bread, wine, herbs, "hail + wassail", clay pipes, loaves deep + snuff. Cost 2 guinea each (£6.00) - a lot for me but worth it. The Pink loved it. Sent next to Dr. Parr, Head of the N.Y. Natural History Museum, + his family. Delighted. Home on top of bus - found the Pinks just about to leave. Having stopped in to see us. They came in for about an hour & a half. Very pleasant time. One of the best days.

5th To Harrods; bought tea pot for E. Beall, + 2 tie for boys. Then some stamps - nearby arcade, and lunch

at a fine place, "Stockport" - but
excellent food.

Then back to hotel & to K.L.W.
terminal. Waited 1 1/2 hrs, then bus
to airport, & there was John! He came
from Stockholm a day early to see us
& when ~~we~~ ^{he} called we had checked
out! Saw him for 5 minutes & we
had to go. But so nice of him.
Very good plane trip to Amsterdam,
with dinner. To Victoria Hotel,
& hot chocolate on sidewalk
cops. Good hotel. Come to hear
every night.

6th Morning boat trip thru canals.
Not too good. Grey day, partly at fault.
P.M. trip to Volendam & Marken.

V. completely spoiled by tourists, not
by any means all American, & trashy
shops. Bags bought wooden shoes.
Marken very attractive - Partly because
Sunday & no stores open - strong Protestant
founded by Norwegians. V. founded
by Spaniards & all Catholics.
Preferred cork shoes to Marken. Very
pretty.

Little boys, skirts, long hair until 6,
Tall dep. - blue apron, & white stripe
down front of bodice.

Trud to get car arranged. Free trial, nice.
Didn't see where to pay.

7th Got car - 1 1/2 hrs late, as in
England. Chevrolet, 1957 4 door
car radio.

Guide to Lakes around - John Somers

~~first museum - ancient Roman, over 2000 years old~~
9th Left for Koblenz, first along Aistabahn + then
along Rhine - mostly traffic there + in a hurry to
catch boat. Got there in plenty of time, + light lunch in
restaurant. Johnny, incident sausage + had one 15" long
1:30 trip up river delightful. Perfect sunny day. Castles
+ ruins + whole countryside beautiful + romantic. Very
green. Vineyards everywhere. River very busy with
large + beautiful barges from many nations (Swiss,
Fr. Belg. as well as German). Carrying various
cargoes. Families aboard. One carried antique, it
was a dog-house, 1 a bicycle, 1 deck chair, + nearly
all had laundry out line. Shoppers aboard, + arrived
Mainz 8³⁵ staged Mainz + after short drive
around part of city.

Flower market, late but still beautiful. ^{Poss. +} ^{Carmelina}
Lunch at Brassenmermeer on lawn beside lake, at restaurant.
Went up windmill, way to top. Saw mechanism of it.
Saw several other for a distance. To Hagen, very brief.
+ Scherreningen where we had tea on beach +
then enjoyed tea in hotel. Bobby left shoes
on back of car. We discovered it 20 min later,
went back, + man at parking place had them.
Saw "Model Village" - 15" to walk thru it. Started
by people whose son died in war. Funds for
students who need medical care. Back to Auld

walk along brook. Delightful lunch
Graf. Leberchen, his daughter, & son-in-law
Graf & Countess Pálffy.
Then short drive to nearby lake - Gertmann
resort. See, & had cool drink & then back
for dinner.

Mon 6/14 - Into Salzburg - car broke fixed, sent on sent
home. Ignace took for 4 children, lunch at
Golden Hind. John bought camera. At too full &
crowded. Carl dined at Schloss, then back to
Salzburg for Marietta, Daisy, Margarete. The Magic
Flute - excellent. Birthday cake for Johnny at
Klemmer. Chocolate, candles & flowers. Brought
Countess Leberchen home.

6/15. Wonderful day. Salzburg, bought a few things, then
to Hellbrunn & saw the water tricks of the
Archbishop. His table & the 8 seats, the remainder
antlers, & place where people walked under water &
then stood to watch the others!

On to where we went up the cable car.
Then on to Leogang & back via Mönsee. Long
country. Long Johnny stayed but he had fun &
went swimming.

Left regretfully. Lunch at small roadside
restaurant then on up Grossglockner Park -
terrific. In 1st gear nearly all the way up & then
Beautiful. The Healy, happy. I stopped at
Heidegallst. for night, nice hotel, simple,

but excellent food. Beautiful view up & down valley. Church, river at bottom.

17- On the same pass + into Ital. Then Dolomite for miles + miles. Three Continents. Last pass steep + narrow then ever narrowing canyon of sheer rock. Quite exciting. Night at Luna Hotel at Bozeng - never heard of it before, but busy, thriving city. Hotel nice - its outdoors. Pleasant.

18. On the same pass. Picnic lunch at top of - looking toward tremendous peaks.

Into Switzerland - and improved nice narrow road for miles of steep pass. Simply beautiful. Scary. Cows with water-fall bells in mountain meadows. Night at Samedan, next to St. Moritz. Dinner at in St. Moritz.

19 - Campbell in early AM. like thickly Chinese glass. On the pass + come again; by Wallen See, to Lucerne. Carlton Hotel - swimming. Dinner on Terrace. Very fine. Weather has been perfect all week.

20 Morning to see things of Lucerne - as moving as ever. Then the Park Garden - of rocks + holes more by them in Glacial Age. But hall of mirrors. As very fine. Then to boat for trip up Pilatus.

1 hr 10⁰ by boat, 40' by funicular, up, up
+ was, often at 48th grade. I was really
very narrow. Translucent view of Lucerne,
Lake, mts, + plain. Then clouds came in
dramatically + quickly blocked off much of it.
Then down in logs for 40'. Quite a trip! Then
we went over the old wooden bridge, + came
home to excellent dinner. Very enjoyable day.

7/21 Bought gifts + souvenirs in a.m.
Car fixed. Man who ran into us yesterday
turned up at garage as arranged + pd bill.
Very fine example of politeness + honesty.
Also, garage did not charge a much as
they know he had given us, so it was
honest, too. If a.k. by Avis Co. in Amsterdam
we will send man to city. so he knows
we, too, are honest.

On three lovely pan + by lake to the
Interlaken to Grindelwald. Lush glimmers
of Jungfrau thru clouds seen on it.
Hotel Park.

7/22 Rainy! But we went up Jungfrau
anyway, + very glad. 1 hr by train +
50' by second, last 40' thru tunnel.
Above clouds on top, + wonderful views.
All had hot soup. Cold. Went thru
Ice Palace, ~~was~~ cut out of Glacier.
Johnny very pale + got mountain fever.

Talked with pleasant Australian couple.
Met Dave + Bill, 2 very nice boys fr Purdue.
All had lunch then drove, 2 hrs, thru clouds
to Grindelwald. John + John staged + the
rest went on to Trummelbach Falls. Very
awesome demonstration of terrific force of
water. Then stopped at Restaurant at foot
of Falls + ordered Fondue at suggestion of Dave +
Bill. Lots of fun. Swiss couple noticed +
came over. ^{Charming,} ^{funny} (clever) ^{woman,} ^{delighted} me liked fondue + gave us the
recipe.

7/23 Left for Italy. Arrived before lunch, +
afternoon then typical.

Left, driving thru beautiful country again
that could only be Swiss. Over high pass ^{with}
cloud, rain + even snow. Stopped to take
picture of cows + big Alpine Roses. Chateau here
+ there sitting, than by roadside. Pass.
Took train, car - jigg - back, for 20 mi. entirely
thru tunnel in complete dark stage for
punctuating lights of other car. Clearly visible
from a way simpler pass. When we came out
we were still in Switzerland, but it
could have been Italy from appearance
- both of houses + people. Had to say good-bye
to Italy. On to Locarno when we met
at Monte Locarno - crossed on + Schaffhausen

They have a brick house directly overlooking Lake Maggiore. Much like their Montreux house except had to be 2 story because of lot. Saw it all, including required bonus shelter! - required of all new houses in Switzerland & Sweden!

On toward Locarno. Stayed at new mine & mining hotel. Noisy, but because of traffic. Dinner on Terrace.

Padua - saw Giotto's on ch. wall.
7/24. On to Italy - with dinner along Lugano but only glimpse of Como. Italy being Autobahn to Milan where we got completely lost but people not much good in helping us. Finally found Church Santa Maria del Grazia where we saw The Last Supper. The building badly ruined during war & in fact in poor condition from that, & had become an awfully from moisture in back, but back now for everyone to see & enjoy.

On thru country - lunch at gas station - there seem to be no decent restaurants in small towns. Spaghetti & fies & thank goodness for espresso. Then

late afternoon arriving finally at Vercinaria (sp?) an old walled town. Hotel Jolly - very good. Fascinating with small thin tower - also, drink at sidewalk cafe & delicious dinner at

Hotel terrace. Hotel faces large, open square. Very pleasant.

- 7/25 To Venice. Left early. Found no reservations at Danieli (we a day earlier than arranged, 2 days earlier than originally planned). John & bags took ferry to Lido & drove to hotel. Jeanne & I took public boat to Danieli for mail. Arr. Express clock until 12 o'clock so we went on to Lido, Hotel Excelsior. A luxury spot, despite lunch, & then joined Jo & boys. Beautiful; huge hotel, very fine quarters. Immediately rented cabana (7³⁰) and spent P.M. on beach & swimming. Water very much like Hawaii, beach better. Delightful, restful time. Dinner on terrace overlooking Adriatic.

7/26 Back to Danieli in Venice. They had assumed we would stay at Lido & had no room! We insisted & after about 2 1/2 hrs wait we got the Royal Suite! Perfectly beautiful, 2 large rooms, 1 with draped damask walls & carved & painted ceiling - very Venetian - carpets, women etc.

The other room - out of this world - 14 gold chain upholstered in gold & green brocade. 8 tables, 2 large desks, 2 huge gold mirrors, luminous fireplace - & 3 beds - Balcony overlooking Grand Canal, with cushion to

lean one's elbow on. And the rooms are
air conditioned.

Very large, partitioned bath room.

Dinner on Roof Garden of Hotel - the only 1st in
Venice mentioned in recent Life issue.

7/27 Morning tour of St. Mark & Doge's Palace
very good.

~~Long morning~~. Boat to Academy of Art -

1 1/2 hrs there, then walking to Rialto.

Lunch at Rialto Hotel. Jimmie met

7 friends. Gondola back to Hotel

Lazy 1st part of P.M. Then hunted
almost an hr, on foot, for little
antique shop I'd seen in A.M. - Finally
found it - closed. Walked home - another
45', & felt exhausted. Dinner on roof
again - Jimmie and six friends

7/28 Morning tour of Saint Mark &
Doge's Palace. Lunch in b-y & on to
station via gondola. Car on 9th floor of
garage. Coasting out of Venice amazing to me
- canals - very flat country road as if a
dyke like Holland. No traffic.

Then near Ravenna - many spots of ice -

paved. road and we were imitated
of Route, Three Ravens & on to
Farli. Stayed at new hotel Luna
Modern, clean, good, but noisy because
of motorcycles. 24 of them, plus a
many bicycles, were parked in front
+ street. Band rehearsing nearby, + I
think a movie nearby too.
Not much Eng. - asked us if we'd care to stand
in + garden - meant sit in garden for
dinner.

7/29 On to Florence ^{mountain pass} Villa la Massa in
Candeli - lovely spot on Arno River,
swimming, good 15th + 17th century bldgs.
- In to town after lunch - wandered around,
back for swim + wonderful dinner
Hot.

7/30 Pitti Palace, cathedral + baptist in A.M.
Leffigi, Fiesole etc in P.M.
The fish. came over for while after
dinner.

Barney - for Cleveland.

7/31 Jimmie + I went shopping both
A.M. + P.M. Linens, especially for
the Trauman. Leathers.
Fishers over for while in evening.

8/1 To Rome via Perugia + Assisi.

Lunch in Assisi. Very hot.

Pisa. Winding, hilly country, reminded us of inland Calif. except for the hill towns which were scattered ^{in many} frequent places.

8/6 Tour of Pisa, Cathedral & Baptistry. Attendant sang notes of chord in latter to show acoustics. Saw light Galileo watched when he determined movement of earth.

On to Italian Riviera for swim. not far beyond Pisa. Wonderful water & sandy beach, many umbrellas & hundreds of people.

Then on - Santa Margherita & Portofino. This is definitely vacation time. Every square inch is taken up by people and/or automobiles & motorcycles.

Beautiful day, magnificent country. Found hotel at Nervi, outside Genoa.

-almost a Ches. Adams place, but at least
clean bed & board in an overcrowded
area.

8/7 Took more than hr. to get thru Genoa
which is tremendous. Tried later to get
mid-morning snack - no luck. Finally,
lunch at new & clean restaurant with
tur, green, lavender, purple & I think a
touch of red & orange in walls & ceiling.
On to border where we were in slowly
moving line for $1\frac{1}{2}$ hrs. Can't see why be-
cause customs procedures were minimum.
Then on to Monaco. Glimpses of outside
of Casinos; drink at ^{Park} Restaurant; watched
change of the guard (one) and then very
lucky in finding a hotel in probably the
most crowded city in the world. Got the
last room; he said it was because someone
had left early, ill; & one room was the
proprietor's children's - they were at camp.
(Had not tried big, very expensive hotel.)
